- The application form is to be used for the notification of up to 2 gaming machines of categories C and/or D under section 282 of the Gambling Act 2005, or for the conversion of an existing section 34 permit issued under the Gaming Act 1968, or an application for the grant of a new, variation or transfer of a licensed premises gaming machine permit under the Gambling Act 2005.
- 2. Before the licensing authority can grant an application (relating to a licensed premises gaming machine permit) the applicant or the person giving notification for the use of up to two gaming machines on premises, must hold a premises licence, issued under the Licensing Act 2003, which authorizes the sale of alcohol for consumption on the premises, which is the subject of the application/notification. Further, the licensed premises must have a bar at which the alcohol is served for consumption on the premises without a requirement that alcohol is served only with food.
- 3. The gaming machines must be located on these licensed premises.
- A 'Premises Licence holder' is a person holding a premises licence issued under the Licensing Act 2003.
- 5. There is no statutory limit to the number of gaming machines which may be applied for although the licensing authority has some discretion in this regard. It should also be noted that the licensing authority can cancel the permit or vary the number and/or category of gaming machines authorised by the permit should, amongst other reasons, the premises be mainly used for making gaming machines available for use on the premises (Schedule 13, paragraph 16(c) of the Gambling Act 2005). You may, therefore, wish to contact the licensing authority to discuss proposed applications.
- 6. A licensed premises gaming machine permit has an indefinite duration unless it is surrendered, cancelled, or forfeited. Further, a permit will cease to have effect if the premises licence authorising the sale of alcohol for consumption on the premises ceases to have effect, or the permit holder ceases to be the holder of the premises licence.
- 7. A first annual fee of £50.00 is payable to the licensing authority within thirty days after the date the permit is issued. Thereafter, an annual fee, of £50.00, is payable before each anniversary of the issue of the permit. Failure to pay the annual fee may result in the cancellation of the permit. [There is no annual fee payable for two gaming machines or less, provided for use under section 282 of the Gambling Act 2005].
- Sections 282 (automatic entitlement of up two gaming machines) and 283 (licensing premises gaming machine permit) of the Gambling Act 2005 provide for the use of Category C and/or D gaming machines.

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- 9.
