Guidance notes

- 1. The application form is to be used for an application for a grant of a family entertainment centre gaming machine permit ("permit") or to request a change of name on the permit, section 247 and Schedule 10 of the Gambling Act 2005. **This form is also to be used for an application to convert an existing permit** issued under section 34 of the Gaming Act 1968 in accordance with Statutory Instrument 2006 / 3272.
- 2. An unlicensed family entertainment centre is entitled to provide an unlimited number of category D gaming machines available for use on the premises. Category D gaming machines are defined Statutory Instrument as (to be completed once SI finalised)
- n.b. no other category of gaming machine is permitted to be used on the premises.
- 3. The permit's duration is 10 years, unless it is surrendered, forfeited, suspended or lapses. A renewal application must be made no earlier than 6 months before the expiry date of the permit but not less than 2 months before its expiry (Schedule 10, paragraph 18 of the Gambling Act 2005).
- 4. The fee for a new application for grant is £300. The fee for the conversion of an existing permit issued under Section 34 of the Gaming Act 1968 permit is £100. The fee for a change of name is £25.
- 5. Applicants should be aware that this licensing authority is preparing a 'Statement of Principles' under Schedule 10, paragraph 7 of the Gambling Act 2005 relating to family entertainment centre gaming machine permits. The Statement of Principles will be made available via this authority's website or via a request made to the contact details provided at the top of the application form.
- 6. This licensing authority must notify the applicant of the grant / refusal of the application for a permit as soon as is reasonably practicable after that decision to grant / refuse has been made.
- 7. Permits cannot be transferred. Change of name is only permitted where the permit holder changes his / her name or wishes to be known by another name (Schedule 10, paragraph 11(2) of the Gambling Act 2005).
