


### **INVESTING IN FIGHTING CRIME**

**BUDGET 2024/25** 



I am determined to see more bobbies on the beat, increases in arrests, more cash and drugs seized off criminals, and ultimately for crime to continue to fall in Lancashire.

"My budget for 2024/25 is about continuing the investment I have made in frontline policing - keeping our local police stations open, recruiting more officers to increase the visible presence on our streets, and investing in specialist teams such as the Roads Policing Team and the Anti-Social Behaviour Unit.

"Lancashire Constabulary has already recruited 612 additional officers, the county wide crackdown on antisocial behaviour through Op Centurion has already delivered more than 14,000 extra hours of Officers walking the beat and

Op Warrior has seen **over** 1,400 crime gang suspects arrested in Lancashire.

"The investments I want to make in this budget will ensure that we can keep up this momentum, build on our successes and push on with my mission to deliver more visible policing, taking the fight to criminals.

"85% of residents who responded to my recent budget survey would like to see Lancashire Constabulary receive more funding. Every penny of the 4.75% rise in council tax precept for 2024/25 - equivalent to 23p a week for a Band D property - will be spent on your priorities and increase visible policing to crack down on crime and ASB and keep Lancashire safe."






GETTING TOUGH ON ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR

My budget will pay for more officers to join the ranks of Op Centurion, the county-wide crack down on Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB).

Since the launch of Op Centurion in July 2023 officers have:

- ✓ spent an additional 14,000 hours walking the beat
- ✓ attended more than 1,300 incidents of ASB
- √ carried out 3,300 stop checks and 600 stop searches



Fighting organised crime in Lancashire

My budget will also continue to support Op Warrior, disrupting and dismantling organised crime to bring more offenders in Lancashire to justice, as well as stripping them of their cash, cars and other assets.

Since its launch in November 2022, Op Warrior has resulted in:

- ✓ 1,409 arrests of organised crime gang suspects
- ✓ 318kg of class A and B drugs taken off our streets
- ✓ £1.3m cash seized from criminals
- ✓ Seizure of 18,249 cannabis plants
