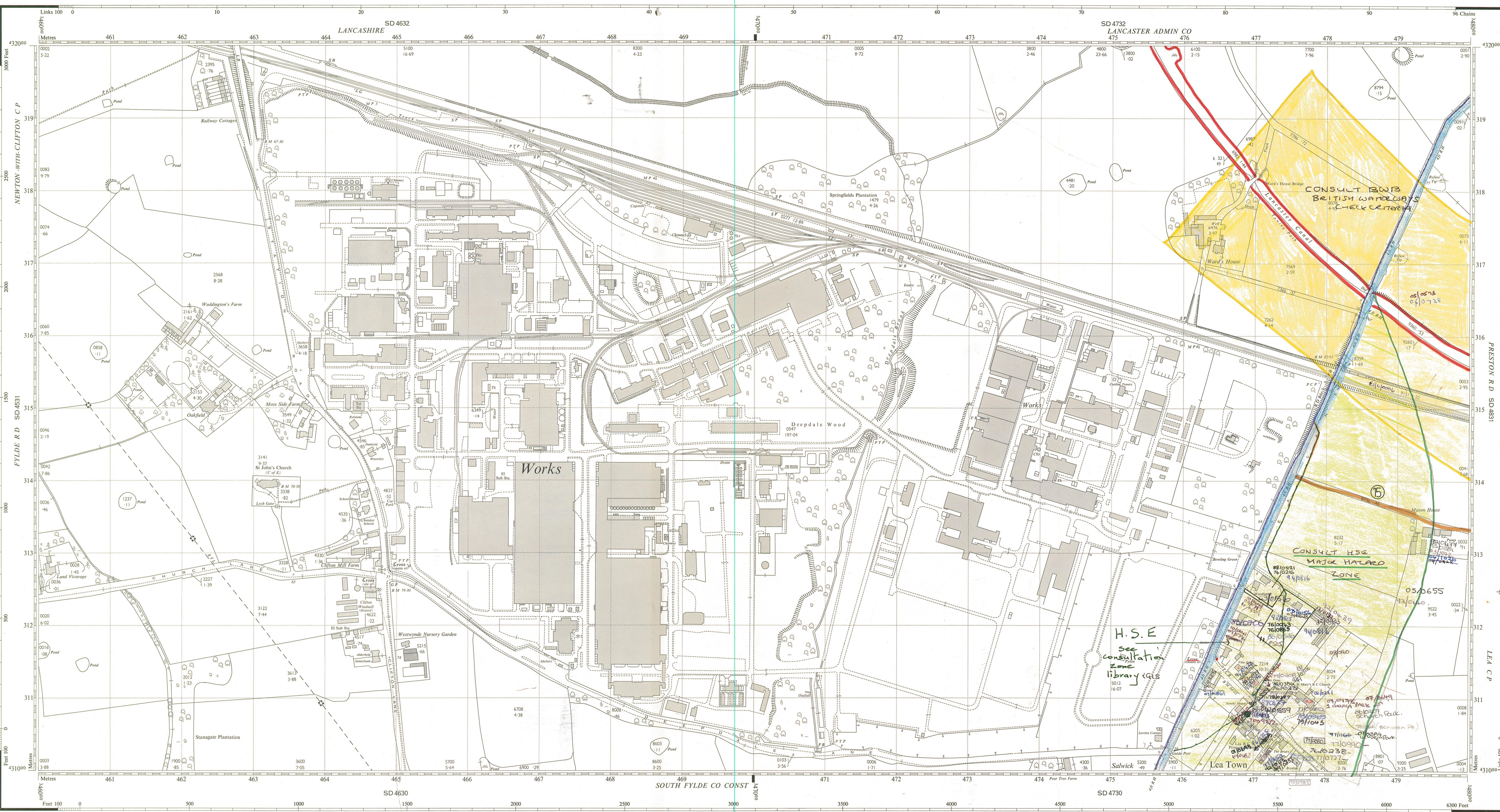

The lines on this plan form part of the National Grid and are spaced at 100 metre intervals. To give a large scale reference defining the position of a point to the nearest 10 metres proceed as follows—
