

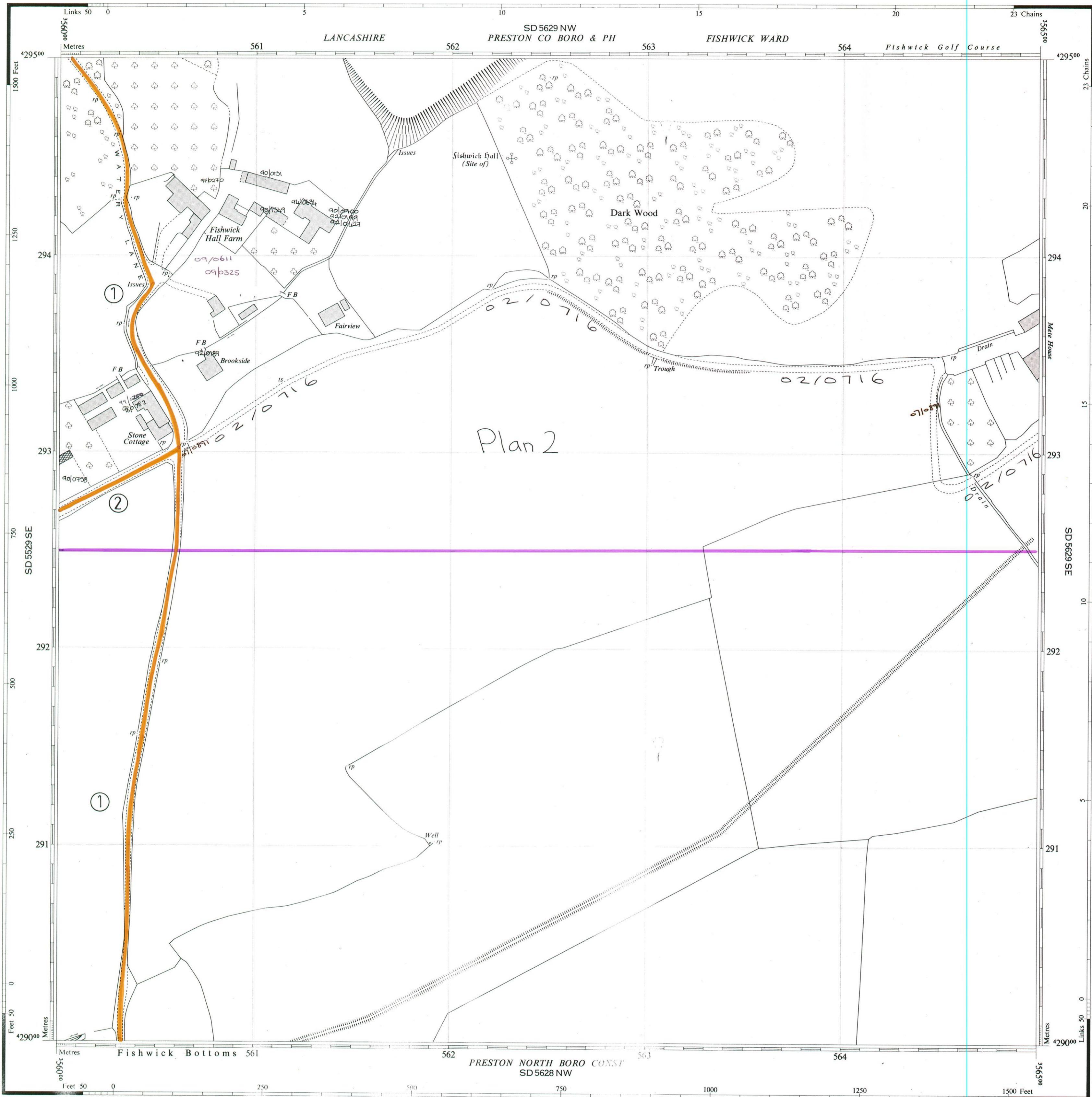

To give a large scale reference defining the position of a point to the nearest 10 metres proceed as follows:—

Take west edge of square in which point lies and read the figures opposite this line on NORTH and SOUTH margins	Take south edge of square in which point lies and read the figures opposite this line on EAST and WEST margins

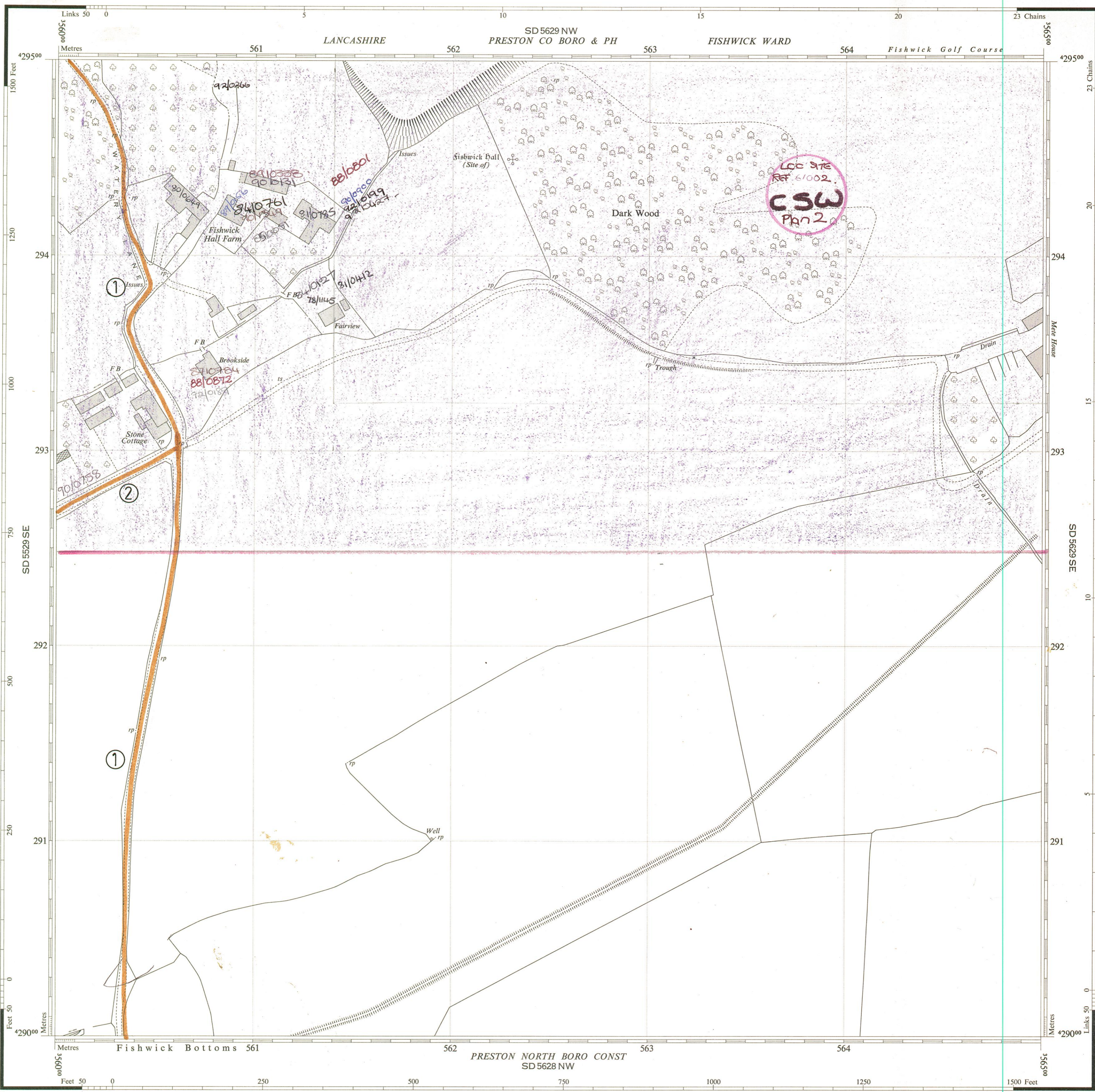
