

LANCASHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL
HIGHWAYS ACT 1980
(DEEPDALE 3 AREA, PRESTON, PRESTON CITY)
(GATING) ORDER 2012



The County Council of Lancashire, ("the Council") in exercise of its powers under **Section 129A-129G** of the **Highways Act 1980** ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers, hereby makes the following Order:

No persons other than statutory undertakers, emergency services or owners or occupiers of premises adjoining or adjacent to the highways which are the subject of the Order, shall have access to the alleyways (hereafter referred to as the Highways), or to keys to the gates restricting access to the Highways; to the rear of addresses: 185-209 Deepdale Road, odd numbers only, St Paul's Road, 130-192 even numbers only, 1-63 Burrow Road, odd numbers only, 1-23 Argyll Road, odd numbers only, 2A Argyll Road, 2-84 Argyll Road, even numbers only, 1-16 Norfolk Road, 1-16 Suffolk Road, 1-16 Stafford Road, 1-16 Dorset Road, 1-16 Nottingham Road, 1-15 Somerset Road, odd numbers only (the Highways).

The alternative routes as proposed as via: Deepdale Road, St Paul's Road, Burrow Road, Argyll Road, Norfolk Road, Suffolk Road, Stafford Road, Dorset Road, Nottingham Road or Somerset Road.

This Order authorises the installation of gates to enforce the restriction of public rights. The maintenance and operation of the gates will be the responsibility of the Director of Environment, Preston City Council, Town Hall, St Paul's Road, Preston, PR1 1PX (Contact tel. 01772 906720 - Operational Property).

It has been shown that anti-social behaviour and/or crime exists in the general area around the highways and this is exacerbated by the free access to the lengths of highway referred to above. The Gating Order would, by limiting access to only those persons indicated in Article 1 of this Order, be beneficial in tackling crime and/or anti-social behaviour in the area. The Council is therefore satisfied that the conditions set out in Section 129A (3) of the Act have been complied with for the purposes of making this Order.
