LANCASHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL HIGHWAYS ACT 1980 (SULBY DRIVE, PRESTON, PRESTON CITY) (GATING) ORDER 2012

The County Council of Lancashire, ("the Council") in exercise of its powers under **Section 129A-129G** of the **Highways Act 1980** ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers, hereby makes the following Order:

- 1. No persons, other than the owners, occupiers, statutory undertakers, or emergency services, shall have access to the alleyways (hereafter referred to as the Highways), or to keys to the gates restricting access to the Highways: to the rear of addresses 1-11 Sulby Drive (odd No's) 6-10 Gamull Lane (even No's) and Bethany House (the Highways). The public right of way along these Highways is therefore restricted at all times.
  - 2. The alternative routes are proposed as: via Gamull Lane, Longridge Road and Sulby Drive
  - **3.** This Order authorises the installation of barrier to enforce the restriction of public rights. The maintenance and operation of the gates will be the responsibility of the Director of Environment, Preston City Council, Town Hall, St Paul's Road, Preston PR1 1PX (contact telephone: 01772 906720 Buildings Management Division).
- 4. It has been shown that anti-social behaviour and/or crime exists in the general area around the highways and this is exacerbated by the free access to the lengths of highway referred to above. The Gating Order would, by limiting access to only those persons indicated in Article 1 of this Order, be beneficial in tackling crime and/or anti-social behaviour in the area. The Council is therefore satisfied that the conditions set out in Section 129A (3) of the Act, have been complied with for the purposes of making this Order.
