

**LANCASHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL
HIGHWAYS ACT 1980
(ASHTON 1 AREA, PRESTON, PRESTON CITY)
(GATING) ORDER 2014**

The County Council of Lancashire, ("the Council") in exercise of its powers under **Section 129A-129G** of the **Highways Act 1980** ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers, hereby makes the following Order:

1. The highways which are subject of this order are the alleyways to the rear of the following addresses 59-75, 93-107 and 109-113 Waterloo Road (odd numbers only), 1-21 and 27-33 Garden Walk (odd numbers only), 2-30 Bank Place (even numbers only) 12-24 and 26-44 Wellington Road (even numbers only) 1-29, 47-57, 71, 75-85a, 87-99 Wellington Road (odd numbers only), 1-5 Webster Street (odd numbers only), 2-6 Threlfall Street (even numbers only), 2-8 Brampton Street (even numbers only), 2-8 Elton Street (even numbers only), 1-7 Elton Street (odd numbers only), 1-9 Brunswick Place (odd numbers only) 2-10 Prospect Place (even numbers only), 2-78 Waterloo Terrace (even numbers only) 112-152 Tulketh Road (even numbers only), 25-105 Waterloo Terrace (odd numbers only) and to the side of no 60 Poulton Street (hereinafter referred to as the Highways).
2. No persons other than statutory undertakers, emergency services or owners or occupiers of premises adjoining or adjacent to the Highways shall have access to the Highways or to keys to the gates restricting access to the Highways. The public right of way along the Highways is therefore restricted at all times.
3. This Order authorises the installation of barrier to enforce the restriction of public rights over the Highways. The maintenance and operation of the gates will be the responsibility of the Director of Environment, Preston City Council, Town Hall, St Paul's Road, Preston, PR1 1PX (contact telephone number 01772 906720 Operational Property Division).
4. It has been shown that anti-social behaviour and/or crime exists in the general area around the highways and this is exacerbated by the free access to the lengths of highway referred to above. The Gating Order would, by limiting access to only those persons indicated in Article 1 of this Order, be beneficial in tackling crime and/or anti-social behaviour in the area. The Council is therefore satisfied that the conditions set out in Section 129A (3) of the Act, have been complied with for the purposes of making this Order.
