

**LANCASHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL
HIGHWAYS ACT 1980
CLEAN NEIGHBOURHOODS AND ENVIRONMENT ACT 2005
(ALLEYWAY BETWEEN 38A/40 BEECHWOOD AVENUE AND 35A/37
CADLEY CAUSEWAY, FULWOOD, PRESTON CITY)
(GATING ORDER) 2007**

The County Council of Lancashire ("the Council") in exercise of its powers under **Section 129A** of the **Highways Act 1980** ("the Act") and of all other enabling powers, hereby makes the following Order:-

1. No persons, other than the owners, occupiers, statutory undertakers, or emergency services, shall have access to the alleyway (hereafter referred to as the Highway), or to keys to the gates restricting access to the highway running between 38a/40 Beechwood Avenue and 35a/37 Cadley Causeway, Fulwood, Preston (Footpath No.53, Fulwood).
2. The alternative routes will be via Cadley Causeway, Rossall Road or Causeway Avenue, Beechwood Avenue and vice versa.
3. The maintenance and operation of the gates will be the responsibility of the occupier of 38a Beechwood Avenue, Fulwood. 4. It has been shown that anti-social behaviour and/or crime exists in the general area around the highway and this is exacerbated by the free access to the length of highway referred to above. The Gating Order would, by limiting access to only those persons indicated in Article 1 of this Order, be beneficial in tackling crime and/or anti-social behaviour in the area. The Council is therefore satisfied that the conditions set out in Section 129A(3) of the Act, have been complied with for the purposes of making this Order.
5. This Order shall come into force on the 25th day of August, 2007 and may be cited as the "Lancashire County Council Highways Act 1980 Clean Neighbourhoods And Environment Act 2005 (Alleyway Between 38A/40 Beechwood Avenue And 35A/37 Cadley Causeway, Fulwood, Preston City) (Gating Order) 2007."
